

Georgia Police Accreditation Regional Coordinator Program (RCP Pilot)

Mission Statement

The mission of the GPAC Regional Coordinator Program is to provide an effective channel of communication between our membership and the Executive Board of Officers. We are committed to providing training, networking, mock assessments and other resources to agency members in our regions. We are organized, trained and committed to effectively recruiting members from every area of public safety that are eligible for membership in Georgia Police Accreditation Coalition, GACP State Certification and CALEA. We will facilitate and assist in committees designated by the Executive Board. We will work to accomplish our mission in a manner that inspires the trust and confidence of all that we serve.

The program's primary goals are:

- to establish an open line of communications between and among our membership and its Executive Board of Officers;
- to facilitate the education of other public safety personnel with regards to GPAC's mission, purpose, and benefits;
- to recruit other agencies and personnel to join GPAC and take advantage of the training, networking, and services that we provide;
- to establish a resource for agencies requesting mock assessments, file review and policy guidelines; and
- to assist the Executive Board with committee projects, training conferences and membership projects.

Guidelines:

1. Regional Coordinators must submit a letter of intent which also lists their reasons for wanting the appointment, as well as a letter from their Chief Executive Officer supporting their appointment.
2. Regional Coordinators must commit to attend at least two of the four GPAC regular meetings and the GPAC Summer Training Conference.
3. Each coordinator will be appointed by the President after the board has voted on each candidate.
4. Each candidate for Regional Coordinator will be appointed for two years and there will be no limit on the number of terms a Regional Coordinator can serve.
